WHERE WE'VE COME FROM

Volunteer Building Cambodia (VBC) was started in January 2014 by local Cambodian man, Sinn Meang, who has had over 20 years experience in construction and 4 years experience working for NGOs as Building Manager. Throughout the year, VBC has received an immeasurable amount of local and international support. We have employed a full-time builder and casual social worker who are both studying English 5 nights a week to further their education. We teamed up with local NGOs and worked in villages as far as Battambang and Preah Vihear to help families most in need.

- 57% of households have no toilet facilities
- 53% of rural households do not have an improved water source
- Child mortality rates are 3x higher in poor households²

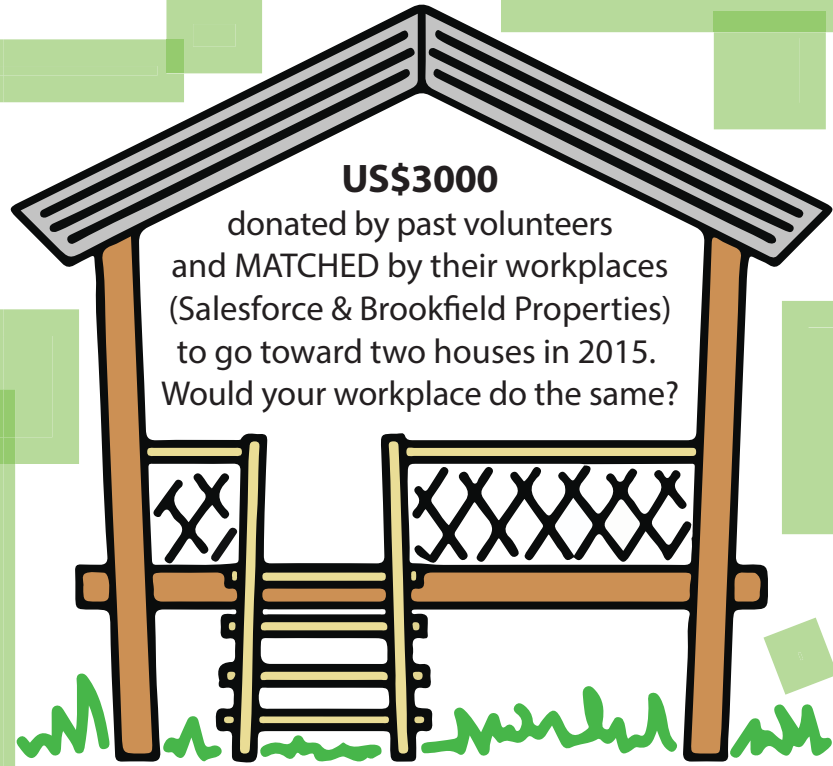


Teaming up with GTEC Geelong from Australia to build a playground for local NGO school, ABCs and Rice

From the start we immediately felt like part of a larger family, all with a shared purpose to make a difference in the lives of those who truly need it.

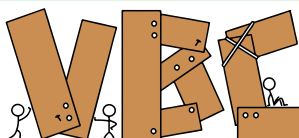
